- (b) All interested parties, including the undersigned counsel and those listed on the Applicant's Certificate of Service.
2. If you (or your attorney) fail to appear in person at the Docket Call at the above time and place, the Special Master will issue a recommendation that the District Court grant the SDR's Application, and deny your objection to the SDR's determination of your claim.
 3. If you (or your attorney) appear at Docket Call, the Special Master may then hear the dispute on the merits, or establish a schedule for a future hearing on the merits. The Special Master will seriously consider any proposal regarding scheduling jointly proposed by the parties at or before the docket call. The Special Master strongly encourages you (or your attorney) to contact the SDR's undersigned counsel to discuss scheduling of any matter relating to the dispute well in advance of the Docket Call.
 4. A court reporter will not be available at the Docket Call. If a party wishes to make a record, the party must make arrangements for a court reporter.
 5. The Master's recommendation issued at the Docket Call or any subsequent hearing will be submitted to the District Court. An order entered by the District Court regarding the disposition of the dispute is a final judgment pursuant to Texas Insurance Code section 443.257.
